






- 1) If printed in black and white, color or paint and let dry.

Note: If you're snow man is really a snow woman, draw on some eye lashes :-)



George Washington's home was a farm called Mount Vernon. As an adult,

he married a woman named Martha Custis. Martha had two children, and George helped raise them. At this time, there were a lot of people living in America who did not want America to be part of England anymore. George Washington was chosen to be the Commander in Chief of the American army. He fought in the Revolutionary War so that America



could be a separate country. After a long and difficult fight, America won the war and gained its independence from England. 




